Specific entry requirements

At least the grade G (pass) on the courses Applied communication in biomedicine 1 including philosophy of science and bioethics, Applied communication in biomedicine 2, Frontiers in translational medicine, Laboratory animal science in theory and practice, and Biostatistics, within the Master's programme in Biomedicine.

Objectives

Upon completion of the course, the student should be able to:

- orally and in writing present biomedical problems/projects to the general public,
- present a biomedical issue to the general public in a scientifically and ethically correct manner.

Content

The course covers the importance of communicating research to the general public and practical tools for written and oral popular science communication.

Teaching methods

Instruction is based on lectures, seminars and group and/or individual assignments.

Examination

Examination is by individual written and oral presentations of assignments.

The grades for each assignment are Fail/Pass/Pass with distinction. To obtain a grade of Pass for the course, the student must obtain the grade of Pass for both the written and oral presentations. To obtain a grade of Pass with distinction for the course, the student must obtain a minimum grade of Pass for both the written and oral presentations and the grade of Pass with distinction for at least one of these presentations.

Compulsory participation

Participation in seminars and group work is compulsory. The course director assesses if and, in that case, how absence can be compensated. Before the student has participated in all compulsory parts or compensated absence in accordance with the course director's instructions, the student's results will not be registered in LADOK.

Limited number of examinations or practical training sessions

Students who have not passed the regular examination are entitled to participate in five more examinations. If the student is not approved after four examinations, he/she is recommended to retake the course at the next regular course date, and may, after that, participate in two more examinations. If the student has failed six examinations/tests, no additional examination or new admission is provided.

The number of times that the student has participated in one and the same examination is regarded as an examination session. Submission of a blank examination is regarded as an examination. An examination, for which the student registered but not participated in, will not be counted as an examination.

If there are special grounds, or a need for adaptation for a student with a disability, the examiner may decide to deviate from the syllabus's regulations on the examination form, the number of examination opportunities, the possibility of supplementation or exemptions from the compulsory section/s of the course etc. Content and learning outcomes as well as the level of expected skills, knowledge and abilities may not be changed, removed or reduced.

Transitional provisions

The course has been cancelled and was last offered in the autumn semester of 2021. Examination according to this syllabus will be given for the last time in the spring semester of 2025 for students who have not completed the course with a passing grade.

Other directives

The course language is English.

Course evaluation will be carried out in accordance with the guidelines established by the Board of Higher Education.

Oral evaluation in the form of course council meetings will be carried out during the course.

Literature and other teaching aids

Course literature is papers and material handed out during the course.
