

Schedule – Course Degree project in Toxicology 2023-2024

Course leaders: Annika Hanberg, Johanna Zilliacus

Thursday 30 November 2023, 9-16, Room: 221, building 75. Introduction to course, Systematic literature search, assessment criteria, ethical approval. Students inform each other about their projects (very brief, no slides) (Annika Hanberg, Johanna Zilliacus)

Christmas holiday period (25 December – 5 January): agree with your supervisor when and where to work on your project.

Friday 12 January: Follow-up at the start of the project. The aim is to check that everything is going well with the project. The students answer questions and upload on Canvas by 16.00. Instructions and questions are found on Canvas.

Monday 15 January at 9-16, Room: Gunnar Höglund: Methods (Johanna). Short (5 min) project presentations (with a few slides) by all students. Group dynamics, 13-16 (Annika).

9-12 **Sustainable development** (Hanna Karlsson), **Adverse Outcome Pathways** (Anna Beronius).

13-16 WS **How to write an introduction.** How to give feedback (Jenny Siméus, KIB). All students should have started to write their introduction before the WS.

End of February/beginning of March, room TBD. Individual half-time meeting (30 minutes each) with one of the course leaders (Annika or Johanna). Course leaders contact students to decide on time for each student.

Wednesday 28 February: Each student uploads a 2-page draft of their Introduction on Canvas. Deadline **16.00!** You will receive feedback on two pages of your introduction, written with normal font size, spacing and margins. We encourage you to submit your entire introduction, however, even if it exceeds two pages – but please indicate (in the document) which two pages you want us to focus on during the session.

Wednesday 6 March: Peer-review process. Each student is primary reviewer on another student's draft and gives feed-back to the author on Canvas by **16.00**.

Wednesday 13 March: Each student uploads a revised version of their draft on Canvas by **16.00**.

Tuesday 19 – Thursday 21 March, Zoom: Anna/Jenny/Gabriella give **individual feedback** on the revised drafts. Students will be contacted to book a 30-minute meeting with them.
