


do indeed, but as mentioned also during the reflection, more practical's e.g. on difficult discussion could be added.

There was a good attendance throughout of some 30 students being in the classes.

The common theme – so the alignment was seen and I am also happy that they felt that critical thinking was supported. Also, they realized learning opportunities. The demands of the course was felt quite right.

In my view, the course has promoted a scientific way of thinking and reasoning (e.g. analytical and critical thinking, independent search for and evaluation of information).





In the open text feedback the students also highlighted the "applied" structure but several also wanted to have even more practical development in groups.

In general, students have been happy with the course so far. Positive feedback

- Good general structure
- Good content
 - Nice to hear about "real" experiences/ insights
 - Nice to be introduced to new/relevant topics
 - o Alot of knowledge in a short time

Suggestions for improvement

- Structure
 - Would be nice if the course was longer (to have more time for the assignment)
 - Would be nice with less self-study and more contact time (lectures) to be able to discuss and ask questions
- Content
 - The link between project management and ethics should be clearer Maybe include a practical exercise?
 - Would be useful to have more information about potential conflicts

- o TB lecture: Would be useful to receive an introduction to the topic
- Maybe a good idea to have the opportunity to get "more hands-on experience"/practical exercises
- o Would be nice to be given more information about the assignment

The course leader's reflections on the implementation and results of the course

The alignment and the overall interest by the students on the topic is a major asset. The examination is a practical application.

On overall the course structure and the assignment is appreciated

More practical's will need to be included.

At times the relevance to "management" needs to be explained more explicitly.

A peer-review is clearly beneficial and was highlighted by the students – but we need to see how this can be integrated without glitches in CANVAS...

The assignment clearly indicated that the students understood the core of the course – thus the well done assignments have me the impression that the essential learning objectives were indeed grasped

Course leader's conclusions and suggestions for improvement

- Include more practicals (difficult discussions, discussion of the project breakdown etc)
- Make the relevance / interconnection between ethics and management clearer
- Think about a potential peer-review

Other comments
