1. Description of any implemented changes since the previous course

In the previous course the group assignment was oral and written. This time the group assignment was oral only, and the writing was done individually.

2. A brief summary of the students' evaluations of the course

The majority of the respondents stated they developed valuable skills in the course (some to very large extent) and 50% stated that there was a common theme between learning outcomes and examination.

3. The course-responsible reflection on the course implementation and results

Course strengths: Course was well organised and the students enjoyed seeing different health plans.

Course weaknesses: The students commented on 'free riding' on the group assignment, in which some students did not carry their share of the work. This is inherent in all group



assignments as the students are to work in a group without supervision to complete the assignment. Part of the group assignment grading is to share roles in the group presentation and ensure each person presents.

The evaluation showed that the students would have wanted to have a longer course, although there is no space for this in the schedule currently.
