As can be seen below, the course was well received by the students, as were the journal club, the seminar on air pollution and the epidemiology workshop. There were mixed comments on the pace and content of the course, which probably reflects differences in students' prior knowledge of the topic. The main piece of feedback was that the level of content and learning from the lectures and workshops related to more general skills (e.g. reading, writing, presentation skills and AI management) was generally lower than expected.
